Recommend Healthy Meal Choices

Little Pals Playgroup has its own kitchen where staff can cook and prepare hot and cold food for the children. A family day picnic is being arranged by the playgroup. Families with babies and young children have been invited.

You've been asked to recommend healthy meal choices for the babies and young children at the playgroup picnic. The meal you recommend **must** meet Government dietary recommendations. In Task 4 you will either prepare a feed or your meal choice.

You must:

- Compare these **two** different milk formulas for babies:
 - Lactose free milk
 - Goat milk
- Describe how each formula meets the nutritional needs of babies aged 0-6 months
- Recommend a two-course packed lunch for the children aged 2 to 3 years old attending the picnic
- Describe how your meal choice meets the nutritional needs of the children aged 2 to 3 years old
- Explain how your meal choice meets the Government dietary recommendations
