Millais is an outstanding girls' comprehensive school for students aged 11 – 16. Situated on the east side of Horsham in attractively landscaped grounds, the school offers excellent specialist facilities and accommodation to deliver an extensive curriculum to all pupils. Mathematics, modern foreign languages and design technology are taught in a stylish new building and the refurbished frontage creates a stunning entrance and foyer for the school.

Integral to the new build and carefully planned in existing areas of the school we have installed the latest technology in our classrooms, providing Wi-Fi and wired connectivity throughout, giving us an excellent ICT network. The Curriculum

On arrival all students are placed in mixed ability tutor groups and these usually remain constant throughout the school. Initially in Year 7 the same groups are used for teaching purposes but setting for most subjects is introduced in stages. Every effort is made to enable and encourage all students to reach a level in every subject which is commensurate with their ability, by providing a relevant and differentiated curriculum. To ensure that students make the most of all learning opportunities, their academic and personal development is monitored closely; progress is checked and appropriate targets for improvement are set. Our expectations are high and we take great pride in providing for students of all abilities and in enabling them to succeed.

We pride ourselves on maintaining a broad curriculum. All subjects are important and students are given the opportunity to continue with studies they enjoy up to GCSE. We have a unique offer amongst local schools for languages provision with students studying French or Spanish with either German, Italian or Mandarin Chinese. The provision for creative arts, technology and physical education is outstanding and our students excel across all disciplines.

Our extensive global links ensure that a wider international perspective permeates all aspects of the curriculum and the life of the school.

Extracurricular provision is a strength at Millais; there are a wide range of school clubs, field trips, educational visits, musical and dramatic performances, entry for local/ national competitions and a variety of international links and exchanges on offer. We run exchanges to Germany (Year 9) and Spain (Year 10) and residential trips (languages and culture) to China (Year 11) and France (Year 8). Many girls enter the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme and Young Enterprise which are very popular. Exciting activities take place during Activities Week which provides a different educational experience for the girls at the end of the academic year.

Care and Welfare

The school provides a safe, nurturing environment within which students are able to make the most of opportunities provided during their stay with us. Great importance is placed on caring for the individual in personal, social and intellectual terms. Our tutor system, Personal Development programme and assembly themes enable pupils to develop an understanding of how to make positive choices and develop skills that stand them in good stead for life within school and beyond in the wider world. We place great emphasis on supporting the physical and mental health of all our students.

Students are encouraged to take pride in the school and have a sense of identity. Emphasis is placed on making sure that girls have a wide cultural perspective and a set of values which equip them for the challenges of everyday life.

Support

Students whose needs extend beyond the formal curriculum are offered additional help through in-class support or specialist intervention, on an individual or small group basis, and carefully prepared work within subjects which is appropriate to their needs. The Special Educational Needs and Disability provision is the responsibility of all teachers and they are assisted in this by our Learning Support Assistants who offer advice, expertise and training.

Teachers give tutorial help to students who need additional assistance or who wish to raise issues connected with their school work.

Healthy Lifestyles

At Millais we promote healthy lifestyles and teach about healthy choices in all aspects of our pupils' lives. Fresh, healthy and nutritious meals are prepared on site by our own catering team and the school has worked hard to incorporate the food standards for schools as part of our way of encouraging all our students to lead healthier lifestyles.

In physical education the emphasis is on participation and enjoyment. High standards are achieved through extracurricular clubs, practices, inter-form and inter-school matches in a wide range of sports.

STEM

We provide many opportunities for students to engage in STEM subjects (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics) and we lead on the delivery and support of high quality Professional Development for teachers in these subjects. We see it as our role to nurture enthusiasm and interest in STEM to prepare our students for the technological age in which they live and give them the basis for the best career options.

PTA

Home school links are a very important part of school life and parents are encouraged to be involved and provide support for their daughters in all aspects related to school. The school has a thriving parents' association, the Millais PTA, which was set up to support the education of pupils and helps the work of the school in numerous ways in addition to fundraising.
